Luke 23:34 "Forsaken"

Approaching the Word—Responsive Litany

First Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:19-21

All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation: that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Dealm 22.1_11

Psalm 22:1-11		
Pastor:	My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?	
People:	I have cried desperately for help, but still it does not come.	
Pastor:	During the day I call to you, my God, but you do not answer.	
People:	I call at night, but get no rest.	
Pastor:	But you are enthroned as the Holy One, the one whom Israel praises. Our ancestors put their trust in you; they trusted you, and you saved them.	
People:	They called to you and escaped from danger; they trusted you and were not disappointed.	
Pastor:	But I am a worm and not human, despised and scorned by everyone! All who see me make fun of me; they stick out their tongues and shake their heads.	
People:	"You relied on the Lord," they say. "Why doesn't he save you? If the Lord likes you, why doesn't he help you?"	
Pastor:	It was you who brought me safely through birth, and when I was a baby, you kept me safe.	
People:	I have relied on you since the day I was born, and you have always been my God.	
Pastor:	Do not stay away from me!	

People: Trouble is near, and there is no one to help.

Gospel Reading: John 10:14-29

Jesus continued, "I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father." Again the Jews were divided because of these words. Many of them were saying, "He has a demon and is out of his mind. Why listen to him?" Others were saying, "These are not the words of one who has a demon. Can a demon open the eyes of the blind?" At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the

Messiah, tell us plainly." Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand."
