# **Approaching the Word—Responsive Litany**

Pastor: Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly.

# First Reading: 1Timothy 5:1-8

Do not speak harshly to an older man, but speak to him as to a father, to younger men as brothers, to older women as mothers, to younger women as sisters—with absolute purity. Honor widows who are really widows. If a widow has children or grandchildren, they should first learn their religious duty to their own family and make some repayment to their parents; for this is pleasing in God's sight. The real widow, left alone, has set her hope on God and continues in supplications and prayers night and day; but the widow who lives for pleasure is dead even while she lives. Give these commands as well, so that they may be above reproach. And whoever does not provide for relatives, and especially for family members, has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.

Pastor: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

**Responsive Psalm** Psalm 27:1, 3-10, 13-14

Pastor; The Lord is my light and my salvation; I will fear no one.

People: The Lord protects me from all danger; I will never be afraid.

Pastor: I have asked the Lord for one thing; one thing only do I want:

People: to live in the Lord's house all my life, to marvel there at his goodness, and to ask

for his guidance.

Pastor: In times of trouble he will shelter me.

People: He will keep me safe in his temple and make me secure on a high rock.

Pastor: So I will triumph over my enemies around me.

People: With shouts of joy I will offer sacrifices in his temple; I will sing, I will praise the

Lord.

Pastor: Hear me, Lord, when I call to you! Be merciful and answer me!

People: When you said, "Come worship me," I answered, "I will come, Lord." Don't hide

yourself from me.

Pastor: Don't be angry with me; don't turn your servant away.

People: You have been my help; don't leave me, don't abandon me, O God, my Savior.

Pastor: My father and mother may abandon me,

People: but the Lord will take care of me.

Pastor: I know that I will live to see the Lord's goodness in this present life.

People: Trust in the Lord. Have faith, do not despair. Trust in the Lord.

## Gospel Reading: John 16:16-24

Jesus continued, "A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me." Then some of his disciples said to one another, "What does he mean by saying to us, 'A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me'; and 'Because I am going to the Father'?" They said, "What does he mean by this 'a little while'? We do not know what he is talking about." Jesus knew that they wanted to ask him, so he said to them, "Are you discussing among yourselves what I meant when I said, 'A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me'? Very truly, I tell you, you will weep and mourn, but

the world will rejoice; you will have pain, but your pain will turn into joy. When a woman is in labor, she has pain, because her hour has come. But when her child is born, she no longer remembers the anguish because of the joy of having brought a human being into the world. So you have pain now; but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you. On that day you will ask nothing of me. Very truly, I tell you, if you ask anything of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will receive, so that your joy may be complete."
