

September 7, 2025 – Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost Divine Service Setting Four

AS WE GATHER

Jesus' words in our Gospel reading seem very harsh. "If anyone comes to me and does not *hate* his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:26). What does Jesus mean by this? C. S. Lewis has a quote that helps us sort this out. He says, "Aim at Heaven and you will get earth 'thrown in: aim at earth and you will get neither" (*Mere Christianity*, chapter 20). Following Jesus means "aiming" at Jesus; we look to Jesus and expect from Him all good things; we look to Jesus and trust Him to be our sure refuge, defense, and help in trouble; in short, we "aim" at Jesus, fearing, loving, and trusting in Him above all things (see Luther's Small and Large Catechisms on the First Commandment). When we "aim" at Jesus, following Him as the One from Whom we expect all good and all help, it turns out that we end up receiving all good from Him, even our family. But if we "aim" for family – or anything else – and expect from family or other things what only Jesus can give, we will get neither the thing for which we seek nor Jesus. Let us, then, follow Jesus!

things into idols. Let us also confess that we cannot free ourselves from our sinful

condition. We take a moment of silence to make this confession privately before God our Father.

Pastor: Now, together as His people let us take refuge in the infinite mercy of God, our heavenly

Father, seeking His grace for the sake of Christ, and saying: God, be merciful to me, a

sinner.

People: Almighty God, have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting

life. Amen.

Pastor: Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you

all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore

forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

OLD TESTAMENT READING Deuteronomy 30:15-20

(Life and good, death and evil set before God's people.)

¹⁵ "See, I have set before you today life and good, death and evil. ¹⁶ If you obey the commandments of the Lord your God that I command you today, by loving the Lord your God, by walking in his ways, and by keeping his commandments and his statutes and his rules, then you shall live and multiply, and the Lord your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to take possession of it. ¹⁷ But if your heart turns away, and you will not hear, but are drawn away to worship other gods and serve them, ¹⁸ I declare to you today, that you shall surely perish. You shall not live long in the land that you are going over the Jordan to enter and possess. ¹⁹ I call heaven and earth to witness against you today, that I

have set before you life and death, blessing and curse. Therefore choose life, that you and your offspring may live, ²⁰ loving the Lord your God, obeying his voice and holding fast to him, for he is your life and length of days, that you may dwell in the land that the Lord swore to your fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give them."

EPISTLE READING Philippians 3:2-11 (Paul counts everything a loss for the sake of Christ.)

² Look out for the dogs, look out for the evildoers, look out for those who mutilate the flesh. ³ For we are the circumcision, who worship by the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh—⁴ though I myself have reason for confidence in the flesh also. If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: ⁵ circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; ⁶ as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless. ⁷ But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸ Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ ⁹ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith— ¹⁰ that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, ¹¹ that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

All: Alleluia. I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing

GOSPEL READINGLuke 14:25-35 (Jesus talks about the cost of discipleship.)

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to Luke the fourteenth chapter.

People: Glory to You, O Lord.

²⁵ Now great crowds accompanied him, and he turned and said to them, ²⁶ "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. ²⁷ Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. ²⁸ For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it? ²⁹ Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, ³⁰ saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish.' ³¹ Or what king, going out to encounter another king in war, will not sit down first and deliberate whether he is able with ten thousand to meet him who comes against him with twenty thousand? ³² And if not, while the other is yet a great way off, he sends a delegation and asks for terms of peace. ³³ So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple. ³⁴ "Salt is good, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? ³⁵ It is of no use either for the soil or for the manure pile. It is thrown away. He who has ears to hear, let him hear."
